Problem Issues in Electoral Districts Public Policies Agenda Setting



● Structuring (classifying) problem issues by subsidiarity qualifier



● Determining what problem issues and policies call for public financing



● Analyzing Strategies, programs, budget documents, etc; consulting experts



● Assessing problem issues: scope + urgency + importance = PRIORITY FOCUS & including the problem issue onto the public policy agenda

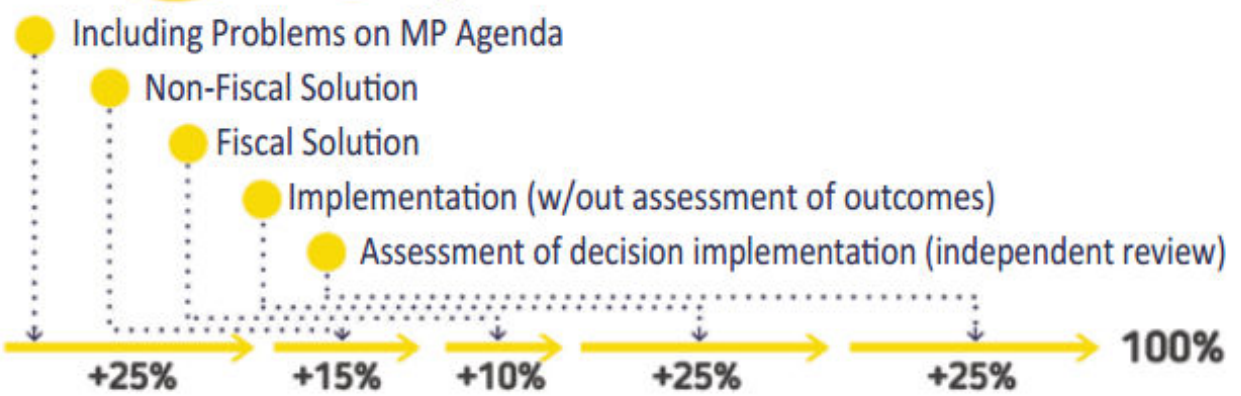
